For Those Living With HPP and/or on Strensiq: Learn More About the COVID-19 Vaccines

The Soft Bones Foundation has received a number of inquiries as to whether there are any concerns about people with HPP and the COVID-19 vaccination. After checking with our Scientific Advisory Board and Alexion, we are not aware of any specific research studying HPP and COVID-19, or any of the vaccines. To decide whether the vaccination is right for you, consult your physician to discuss your medical history, including HPP and other conditions that may be factored into your decision.

For patients on Strensiq, there are no known contraindications with vaccines. Experiences of patients who are on Strensiq and receive the COVID-19 vaccine are being closely monitored. Any and all reactions should be reported to your physician and [OneSource](#).

In the HPP community, there are a number of people who have allergies and intolerances to medicines. Be sure to check with your physician about these concerns when considering the COVID-19 vaccine.
