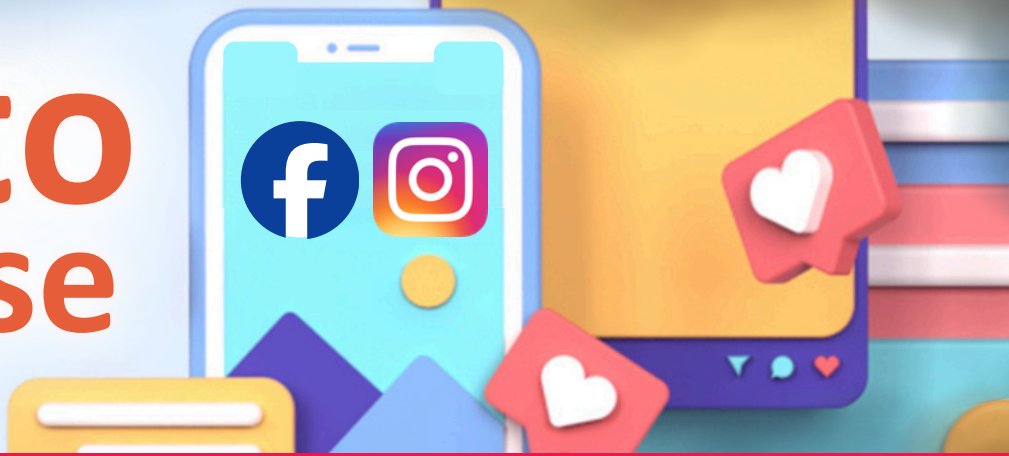

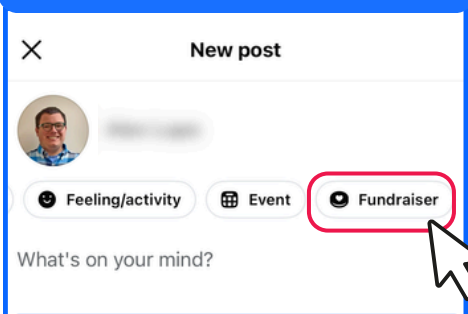


How to Host a Facebook or Instagram Fundraiser

Hosting a fundraiser is fairly simple. Follow these steps to add a fundraising button to your post or Instagram bio. **Pay attention to which social media platform and device you are using, as this will affect which set of instructions you will need to follow.**

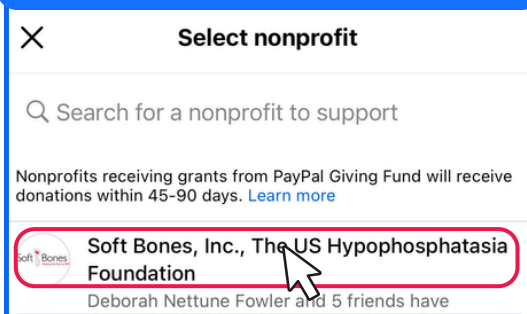
Facebook Steps (Mobile)

Create a new post, and tap “Fundraiser” in the menu



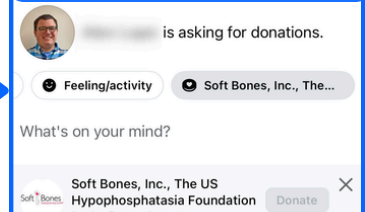
You'll need to scroll right

Tap it once you've found it

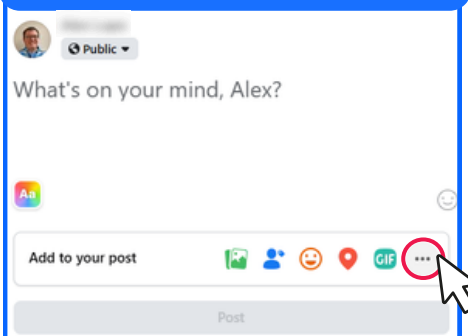
Use sample posts for your post's text, and then publish it!



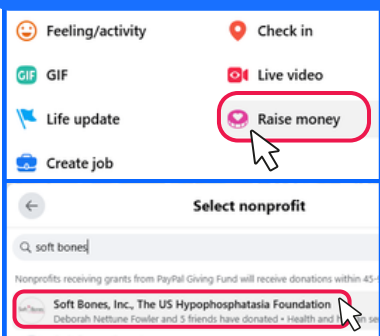

Facebook Steps (PC)

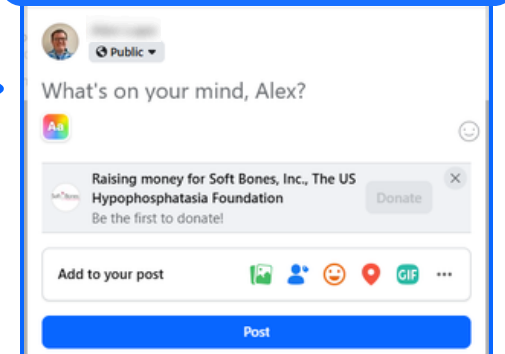
Create a new post, and tap the three dots in the menu



Tap “Raise money”, & search “Soft Bones”



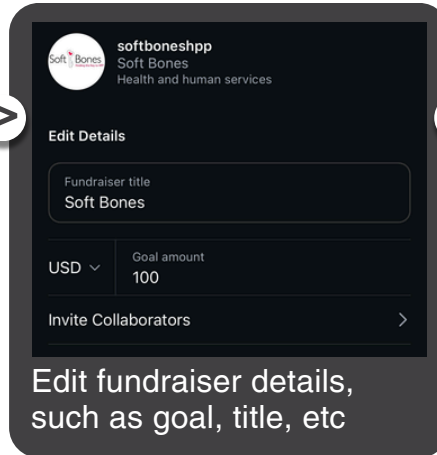
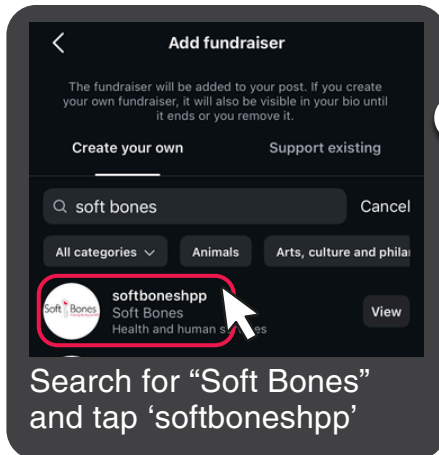
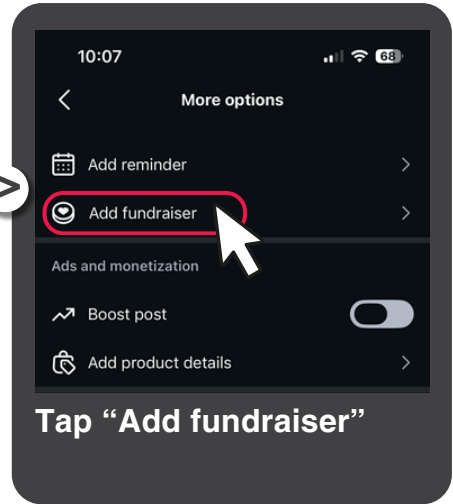
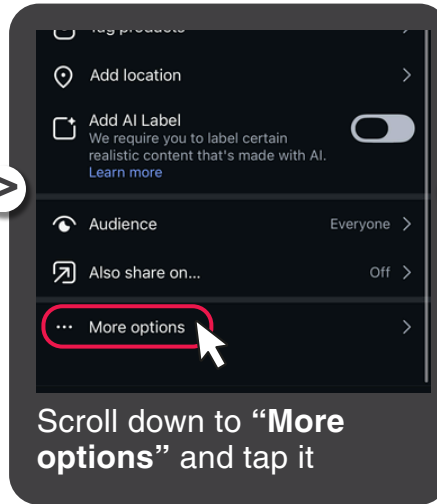
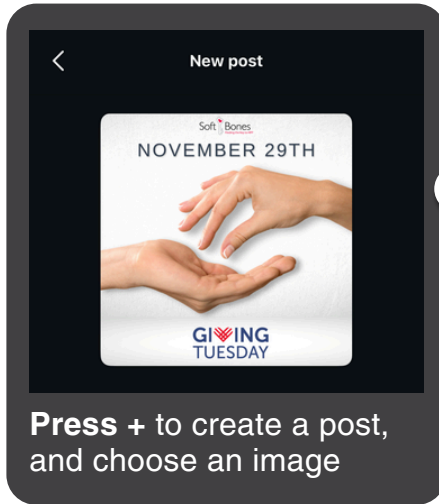

Some Tips & Tricks

 **Tell your story** or why you chose to create a fundraiser.

 **Add photos** to your fundraising post.

 **Share with your inner circle of family & friends** first to gain momentum.

 **Invite friends and families** to like and follow your Facebook fundraiser to increase reach.

 If you initially created a fundraiser on Facebook, you can link your Facebook fundraiser to your Instagram profile. When someone taps the **Donate** button on your Instagram profile, they'll be directed to your fundraiser on Facebook.
